b. Learning Recovery Grant AB1200

<u>Background:</u> The Learning Recovery Grant money is allocated for the purpose of staff retention. To that end, the allocation will be used for a one-time off-schedule stipend for staff.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Approval of the Learning Recovery Grant AB1200 for a one-time off-schedule stipend to staff.

There was conversation about the first & second interims and how the next meeting will have more budget items, the various funds (including reserve and how it is used) as well as Covid funding and the Learning Recovery grant.

The Learning Recovery Grant AB1200 report was reviewed and discussed. The Board approved a one-time off-schedule stipend for all staff. 1.0 - .5 FTE is \$1,500, .5 - .25 FTE is \$500, and <.25 is \$250. AB1200 was approved on a motion by Art Kaslow, seconded by Sean Conroy and passed unanimously.
