9. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

a. Approval of After School Care YMCA Program for grades K-6 onsite.

<u>Background:</u> After conducting a parent input survey and discussing after school care options with the YMCA, the school is poised to offer after school care for grades K-6 (with

TK remaining at Santa Ynez Elementary). There needs to be a minimum of 12 students for the program to run.

<u>Potential Financial Impact</u>: If there are not 12 students, the district could pay the remaining spots (up to 2) with ELO funds. This would cost roughly \$5,000 for each spot.

Recommendation: Approval of After School Care YMCA Program for grades K-6 onsite.

- b. Approve opening the lottery for 1st grade due to very low enrollment, with discussion about the potential and timeline for opening the lottery for any other grade level.

 Recommendation: Approve opening the lottery for 1st grade at this time.
